In 2010, Adam ran for Governor of Illinois in the Republican primary. Adam was proud to be endorsed by Nobel Peace Prize winner and Solidarity founder Lech Walesa, among others.

Adam promised he would post "every dime, online, in real time." Despite a credible loss on Election Day, Adam founded OpenTheBooks.com to fulfill his campaign pledge.
