

Here are the answers to your follow up questions:

Q: Were any Borders Perrin Norrander contracts awarded via the 'Emergency' procurement provisions in the Oregon code or the 'Special Circumstances' provision? A: No.

Q: How many contracts has Borders Perrin Norrander and Oregon Lottery entered into over the past five-years? A Two: Media Buying and Placement, and the Oregon Wins Beneficiary work.

Q: Borders Perrin lost one and how many are still current? Media Buying and Placement is still current. The Media Contract was signed on 6/10/13, and it is extendable for 6 years from the date of signing.

Q: What is the maximum value of the contract that Borders Perrin lost to Pollinate? A: The Lottery awarded and executed a Price Agreement with no monetary value with Pollinate, from which future Work Order Contracts can be entered pursuant to the Price Agreement Terms. Currently the Lottery and Pollinate are working to execute the first Work Order Contract with a Not to Exceed amount of \$221,000.
